How to make a beanie pom-pom

You need 2 circles of cardboard with a hole in the middle of each one. The size of the circles decides the finished size of the pom-pom. Begin with circles about 10cm across, with the holes in the middle about 4cm wide.

Put the 2 cardboard rings together and wrap wool through the hole and around the circle. Wind the wool evenly until the cardboard is covered.

Keep winding until the hole in the centre is almost full. You can change the colour of the wool as you go - this will make a more colourful pom-pom!

With a pair of scissors, slip the point of the scissors through the wool edge and between the two pieces of cardboard, to cut the wool around the edge of the circle. Tie a piece of strong wool between the two cardboard rings and around the middle of the pom-pom, so that the cardboard rings can be pulled away, and the cut wool threads are held firmly to form a ball.

Trim the edges to make the pom-pom a good shape.
